MINISTRY OF THE WORD

Hebrew Scripture: Isaiah 35: 1-10 [The Message]

Wilderness and desert will sing joyously, the badlands will celebrate and flower—
Like the crocus in spring, bursting into blossom, a symphony of song and color.
Mountain glories of Lebanon—a gift.
Awesome Carmel, stunning Sharon—gifts.
GOD's resplendent glory, fully on display.
GOD awesome, GOD majestic. Energize the limp hands, strengthen the rubbery knees. Tell fearful souls, "Courage! Take heart! GOD is here, right here, on his way to put things right And redress all wrongs. He's on his way! He'll save you!" Blind eyes will be opened, deaf ears unstopped, Lame men and women will leap like deer, the voiceless break into song. Springs of water will burst out in the wilderness, streams flow in the desert. Hot sands will become a cool oasis, thirsty ground a splashing fountain. Even lowly jackals will have water to drink, and barren grasslands flourish richly. There will be a highway called the Holy Road. No one rude or rebellious is permitted on this road. It's for GOD's people exclusively impossible to get lost on this road. Not even fools can get lost on it. No lions on this road, no dangerous wild animals-Nothing and no one dangerous or threatening. Only the redeemed will walk on it. The people GOD has ransomed will come back on this road.

They'll sing as they make their way home to Zion, unfading halos of joy encircling their heads, Welcomed home with gifts of joy and gladness

as all sorrows and sighs scurry into the night.

Christian Scripture: Matthew 11: 2-11 [The Message]

John was in prison when he heard what Christ was doing. So John sent some of his followers ³ to ask Jesus, "Are you the one we should be looking for? Or must we wait for someone else?"

⁴ Jesus answered, "Go and tell John what you have heard and seen. ⁵ The blind are now able to see, and the lame can walk. People with leprosy^[a] are being healed, and the deaf can hear. The dead are raised to life, and the poor are hearing the good news. ⁶ God will bless everyone who doesn't reject me because of what I do."

⁷ As John's followers were going away, Jesus spoke to the crowds about John:

What sort of person did you go out into the desert to see? Was he like tall grass blown about by the wind? ⁸ What kind of man did you go out to see? Was he someone dressed in fine clothes? People who dress like that live in the king's palace. ⁹ What did you really go out to see? Was he a prophet? He certainly was. I tell you that he was more than a prophet. ¹⁰ In the Scriptures God says about him, "I am sending my messenger ahead to get things ready for you." ¹¹ I tell you no one ever born on this earth is greater than John the Baptist. But whoever is least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than John.
