Touchstone in the future

Printing and posting *Touchstone* is discontinued immediately. From July, *Touchstone* will be available via the online blog style format that is currently accessible from the MCNZ website. In addition, a pared-back version of the monthly publication will be created as an A4 PDF (10 pages / 20-sides). This PDF attachment will be emailed to all contacts on the Connexional Office database, and those contacts on the dedicated *Touchstone* distribution list, so that parish contacts can print off the pages and distribute to those parishioners and readers who prefer a printed copy and / or do not have access to a digital forum.

The creation and dispatch of two, monthly versions of *Touchstone* will be trialled until December 2023, when the MPB will review the decision. It is envisaged that many readers may transition to the standard blog style online format over the coming months.
