# DCM News- A Place to Call Home-Te Ki a Alasdair.

20 DCM whānau have made a home in Te Kī a Alasdair, Wellington's vibrant new community housing. Te Kī a Alasdair (The Voice of Alasdair), which opened in October 2023, is located on Frederick Street and is one of the newest and largest community housing developments in Wellington.

Comprising 75 purpose-built apartments for those in the community with disabilities and complex needs, the development was the vision of Maurice and Kaye Clark, founders of Kirva Trust, in recognition of their late son Alasdair. Alasdair was well-known at DCM as one of the food bank volunteers and a supporter of society's marginalized people, working hard despite having his own challenges of autism, dyslexia, and dyspraxia.

"Alasdair really opened our eyes" says Kaye, "we are doing this because of him. He changed our lives enormously." Through their son, they became passionate about the need for long-term social housing. When asked about her vision for Te Kī a Alasdair, she says "I want to see the tenants flourish, and feel happier. I want their lives to blossom."
