Dawn Raids 50th Commemoration Project.

The Dawn Raids 50th Commemorations project, led by Te Papa in collaboration with Toi Pōneke, Pātaka Art and Museum, Wellington City Council, and the Ministry of Culture and Heritage, seeks to heal and transform the trauma of the Pacific communities affected by the Dawn Raids. Following the New Zealand government's formal apology in 2021, this initiative has engaged Pacific artists and communities in a series of talanoa workshops held throughout the year. These conversations will culminate in the creation of a large-scale street mural which will be painted on the Wesley Community Action Building. The artist will begin work on Monday 9th September and the unveiling of this important community artwork will be the first event for Conference on Friday 8th November. This is an exciting project for the parish to be a part of and to start our conference in November. It is also significant that the artist is one of our own people, Liana Leiataua.
