<u>Commendation of the 'Safe Faiths'</u> <u>Survey to the Connexion</u>

Dear members of the Connexion,

I am writing to commend to you the 'Safe Faiths' survey, which is open to Takatāpui / Rainbow Christians from all denominations across Aotearoa, as well as allies and advocates of Takatāpui / Rainbow Christians.

This initiative, led by a group of five Christians—including Rev Richard Bonifant (Teaching Fellow at Trinity Methodist Theological College) and Rev Dr Paul Reynolds (Kingi Ihaka Research Centre)—aims to address the critical gap in research and data around whether Takatāpui / Rainbow people of faith feel safe attending their church or faith community. The information gathered from this survey will be invaluable in raising awareness of the challenges faced by Takatāpui / Rainbow people in Aotearoa and in strengthening advocacy efforts both within our churches and in wider society.

This project is hosted by the Kingi Ihaka Research Centre, a Christian kaupapa Māori research centre, and co-created with Diverse Church, a network of safe faith communities in Aotearoa.
