Jesus the Bread of Life

²⁵ When they found him on the other side of the lake, they asked him, “Rabbi, when did you get here?”

²⁶ Jesus answered, “Very truly I tell you, you are looking for me, not because you saw the signs I performed but because you ate the loaves and had your fill. ²⁷ Do not work for food that spoils, but for food that endures to eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. For on him God the Father has placed his seal of approval.”

²⁸ Then they asked him, “What must we do to do the works God requires?”

²⁹ Jesus answered, “The work of God is this: to believe in the one he has sent.”

Thanksgiving:

Leader: The Lord is here

Leader: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People: It is right to give thanks and praise.

Leader: With all your people in Heaven and on earth we give you thanks for Jesus Christ, through whom all things were made; who in the fullness of time became flesh and lived among us, full of grace and truth; who in obedience suffered death on the cross, and was raised in triumph that we might have life. Therefore, we worship and praise your glorious name.

People: Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory.

Leader: On the night he was betrayed, Jesus took bread and after giving thanks broke it and gave it to his disciples saying: Take, eat, this is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

Prayer to the Holy Spirit

Leader: Come Holy Spirit that these gifts may be to us the bread of life and the cup of salvation. Bind us into one body, that we may grow into the fullness of Christ who is the head.

All: Amen. We come to your table, Lord, trusting not in our own righteousness but in your great mercy. We are not worthy even to gather the crumbs from under your table. But you are the same Lord, whose nature is always to have mercy. Grant us therefore, gracious Lord, so to eat this bread and drink this wine that Christ may evermore dwell in us and we in him. Amen.

Breaking Bread:

The bread we break is a sharing in the body of Christ. The cup of blessing for which we give thanks is a sharing in the blood of Christ. Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world.

Invitation:

Come for all things are now ready. Draw near in faith and take this holy sacrament in remembrance that Christ died for you.

Prayer After Holy Communion:

Lord Jesus Christ, we thank you with all our hearts for your mercy and grace. Grant us now and in the days to come a living hope in you; and as we serve you in the world, help us look and work for that day when at your name every knee shall bow and every tongue confess you Lord, to the glory of God, Amen.
